



## **ANIKA CHEBROLU**

nika Chebrolu is a 14-yearold Indian-American girl from Frisco in Texas who recently won the USD 25,000 young scientist challenge for a discovery that could provide a potential treatment for COVID-19.

An eighth grader, Anika won the 3M Young Scientist Challenge, regarded as the US' premier middle school science competition, for her work using in-silico methodology for drug discovery to find a molecule that can selectively bind to the Spike protein of SARS-CoV-2 virus in an attempt to find a cure for the coronavirus pandemic, according to the 3M Challenge website. 3M is an American manufacturing company based in Minnesota.

Chebrolu decided to take part in the Young Scientist Challenge after she battled a severe influenza infection last year. She wanted to find a cure for influenza. However, that all changed after the COVID-19 pandemic hit, the website said.

Chebrolu was one of the 10 finalists in this year's 3M Young Scientist Challenge. In addition to the prize money, she was also awarded an exclusive 3M Mentorship.

As a finalist, she worked with

Ali, who mentored Chebrolu oneon-one throughout the summer. Together, they transformed her idea

3M Corporate Scientist Dr. Mahfuza her project to a judging panel of scientists and leaders. Each finalist was evaluated on a series of challenges and the presentation of

Dr. Ali helped Chebrolu perfect her innovation through the scientific method, and she presented

## NEHA SHUKLA

eha Shukla is a 15-year old Indian-origin who invented a cap that beeps if one is not in a safe distance from

'Girls With Impact' programme in the United States that teaches entrepreneurial skills to young girls. The push for Shukla was the rapid social distancing correctly.

On the inside, there is an ultrasonic sensor, a microprocessor, a buzzer and a nine-volt battery. She coded a programme that causes these ultrasonic sensors to send out pulses (ultrasonic waves). When these waves collide with a person within that six-feet detection range, this raw data calculation is converted to a system that it would understand and hence alert the user.

With immense interest in engineering and technology, Shukla began working on the device that would keep people six feet apart. She started her work in April and a prototype was ready in June. The cap she created beeps and vibrates when someone breaches the six-foot perimeter. It has a microprocessor based device that's embedded in a hat.

Shukla was born and brought up in the United States. She has been featured in the New York Times and on the Nasdaq screen last year.

Andhra Pradesh to receive this award in the field of Art and Culture.

She is a Gold and Silver Medalist in NSKAI State Karate Championship 2018. Recently, she achieved Gold medal in an online All India Martial Arts Open Karate Championship, 2020. She is a distinction holder in Graded Examination in Spoken English Trinity College, London in the year 2018 and 2019. She received Bal



Mitra Award and Sangha Mitra award in the year 2018 and 2019. She is an active marathon runner and participated in many Marathons like Pinkathon, Vizag Bay Marathon and many more.

A student of Delhi Public School, Anandapuram, Sharanya is also a winner of Gold and Silver medals in Olympiads like 7th SOF and 8th SOF International English Olympiad, National Cyber Olympiad among others.

She is a Goodwill Ambassador of an NGO, R Memorial Trust for Project Gyan Patashala. She is also a Brand Ambassador of Inner Wheel Club of Waltair, District 302 for Environmental project, Eco friend. ## EMMA GONZÁLEZ


mma González is an American activist and advocate for gun control. As a high school senior she survived the February 2018 Stoneman Douglas High School shooting in Parkland, Florida, and in response co-founded the gun-control advocacy group 'Never Again MSD'.

After a former student showed up at Marjory Stoneman

Douglas High School in Parkland, FL, with an assault weapon on February 14, 2018, killing 17 students and staff and injuring 17 others, survivors like González immediately sprung to action. In the wake of the shooting, González and her friends Cameron Kasky, David Hogg, Jaclyn Corin and more, helped ignite a conversation about gun violence and, in the following

month, launched the largest youth movement against gun violence that's ever existed.

On the two-year anniversary of the first March for Our Lives, started by students who survived the Parkland shooting in 2018, young activists like Emma González are still doing the difficult work. March for Our Lives and González herself both had extreme global impact on





conversations surrounding gun control and mass shootings, disrupting the notion that they would never make progress in pushing political leaders to take it more seriously.

In March of 2018, González kicked off March for Our Lives, a country-wide rally that captured the streets of major cities across the U.S., in a bone-chilling 6 minute and 20 second speech — most of which was complete silence, to make people around the world understand the excruciating feeling she and her friends felt during the time it took for the shooter to terrorize the school. In total, the speech, with silence, was the same length of time it took him to shoot up the school. Approximately 200,000 people

attended the rally in total.

After the work of Emma and her fellow activists, the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act was passed by Florida lawmakers in March 2018.

The young activist, since she graduated high school in 2018, has gone on to become a student at New College of Florida. In 2020, she's urged people to turn up at the polls and make a difference in their communities and country at large, using their voice and votes as power.

The Cuban, who is unapologetically loud about her identities and standing up for marginalized, at-risk people, continues to frequently organize in her community and uses social media to rally people to use their voices and privilege to make a difference. In recent days, she's even launched a March for Our Lives zine, titled "Unquiet," about continuing to use your voice for the greater good.

González continues to act in the greater interest of her community by organizing for causes and instigating change among local leadership. She has been included in Time magazine's 100 Most Influential People of 2018.

ith 150 Global School Leaders, Educators, Academicians, Higher-Education Stakeholders, Edenablers and Teachers joining the Virtual 4th Global Education Meet 2021, some very creative and useful ideas have made way to our whitepaper.

For effective and efficient restart of Education, here are some ideas put together for your kind reference and use.

We need to teach primary school students how to learn, secondary school students about how to apply that knowledge they have learnt, and in universities we need to encourage students to be curious and ask questions. Teachers need to encourage students and make information useful for them. One must know that 5G won't replace Guruji. - Prof. Mani R S S President, BMA and Vice President -Institutional Development, ITM Group of Institutions

Education consists of three elements - Socializing, Signaling or certification and skill development but with the pandemic the focus has shifted. Digital divide among students needs to be addressed when they come back to school. Every student must be seen as an individual learner to help them not just socially but emotionally too. Quick Response code or QR code allows direct access to the data which the students upload on the designated platforms. A QR code can solve issues of physical contact too. Cloud storage of the study material which the school or institution provides should be done so that any unprivileged student who is living in remote areas or can't attend the class can study with the material on cloud storage. Weekly sports challenges among the students should be conducted on different social media platforms so that other students can take part in that and they can compete and learn while staying at home. - Ms. Neeti Tripathi, Vice Principal, CIDER International School, Chittagong, Bangladesh

Integrate the IT team with the team of educators to make e-learning a better way of studying for children. 



## KARIMUL HAQUE

arimul Haque is a worker in the tea gardens of West Bengal. Locally known as Bike-Ambulance-dada, he has received the Padma Shri award for his work supporting the villagers in and around Dhalabari by bringing sick people to hospital in his motorcycle ambulance. As of 2019, he had ferried approximately 5,000 to 5,500 people free of cost.

In 1995, Haque had gone

ambulance plan came to him when one of his colleagues collapsed on the field. Since a regular ambulance could not reach him in time, Haque tied him to his back and made him ride pillion to the nearest hospital. His co-worker recovered from the illness, inspiring Haque to continue with this approach.

Since 1998, Haque has been providing ambulance coverage to over 20 villages in and around

Rajadanga in Malbazar. He lives with his wife Anjuya Begum, his two sons Rajesh and Raju and their wives. His sons' betel leaf shop and cellphone repair shop in Rajadanga support the family. Most of Haque's income goes into buying fuel and medicines.

He appeared in Kaun Banega Crorepati with actor Sonu Sood on 1st January 2021. Author Biswajit Jha has penned his story in a book named BIKE AMBULANCE DADA: The Inspiring Story of Karimul Hak, The Man Who Saved Over 4000 Lives.




